With 2 managers and teams that knew one another so well, both sets of fans were expecting this final to be a cagey affair, especially with Sun Inn still missing Romani from their side and as such, they matched up identically to ICI Bolton, as well as trying to restrict them with a stifling zonal marking system, and to be fair to Lawton, it did work pretty well as though both sides did manage to test the opposing keeper with a few efforts, it was nothing that a top class goalkeeper couldn't deal with. With both managers opting to motivate their teams fully, it did lead to a few questionable challenges but it seemed either the ref wanted to allow the game to flow or he'd just forgotten to bring his cards or whistle to the game.

He was finally given some real work to do in the 74th minute as he had to send off Tomaski, for pulling down Neer after he had been sent through with just the keeper to beat, allowing his team mates to have a second crack at ICI in the replay, but given the way this game went, this final could well be decided in the end by penalties.

VITORIA GIVEN A HARSH LESSON BY RED STAR AS THEY ARE HIT FOR EIGHT

The brothers Pritchard have both had terrible seasons so far with John's Heebies sitting in 10th place, 6 points behind brother Simon's Vitoria side so Vitoria needed to continue to pick up points just to ensure their safety this season, but the thing they do have going for them is that they are the most star studded side by a margin so theoretically next season should be less painful for their fans.

This week though, Vitoria had to travel to the midlands to play KP's Red Star Rovers side and they can be a tricky proposition at the best of times, but when you travel to a game and not only decide to blood a young keeper but also go into the game without a shred of marking, then you're frankly asking for trouble.

Red Star were eager to put the young keeper under pressure as soon as they could as they were in the fight for a European place for next season and were in need of improving their goal difference in comparison to their rivals. Vitoria's hard tackling

defence had managed to block a few of the home side's early attempts, but with attacks coming thick and fast they couldn't protect him forever so it was a case of when rather than if that they got to test him. The 'when' in that question happened with 17 minutes gone, with defender Rom leaving his role to join up with the attack and he was in just the right place to guide home a beautiful Mcewens pass to open the scoring and he scored his 2nd of the game just 3 minutes later, rising the highest to head home at a corner. With 2 goals in such quick succession, Rovers lost a bit of concentration and this allowed Vitoria to halve the deficit straight from the restart with Kerboga taking full advantage of a slack pass by the home defence, and with that, KP bellowed orders at his team from the sidelines leaving his players in no doubt what he would do at the break if they were to repeat it and his shouts had the desired effect with his team scoring twice in a minute as both Mombassa & Thai Sunn fired in long shots that left the Vitoria keeper grasping at thin air. The young keeper was at fault for Hosea's goal in the 33rd minute, missing his punch at a corner to leave an open goal which a player of Hosea's class wasn't about to pass up, meaning that Red Star were able to go in at the break 5-1

up. It took only 3 minutes into the second half for Aristotle to make it 6-1, dancing through the defence past defenders that were tiring before rounding the keeper to score, the home side then mercifully gave Vitoria a bit of a rest as it took them another 16 minutes before they scored again and once again it was Hosea in the right place to slide the ball home, and the carnage was ended by Copacabana in the 74th minute to make the final score 8-1 to Red Star, and that results moves them up a place into 5th as well as doing the power of good to their goal difference.

As for Vitoria, they are just lucky that there are 3 teams worse than them at the moment, as both The Heebes & Red Storm put up a better fight but along with Olympiakos, they are likely to be the ones relegated as I can't see Heebes picking up the 6 points they need to catch Vitoria.

READ CLOSING IN ON THE DIVISION 2 TITLE

Coming into this week's home game against Appleby FC, Empire City's manager Read had managed to remodel his team to the point where they were only 2 victories away from claiming the 2nd division title ahead of a 4 team battle royale for the remaining 2 promotion places, though they would have to play this week's game missing the influential Simerson but even without him, the home side should have had enough quality in the squad to deal with it. Both managers opted to play matching formations but while young Jack decided to attempt to zonal mark his opponents, Read made sure that he had Hakin & Ceinwyn shadowing Kahlen & Scor Lik Fuk everywhere they went, effectively taking them out of the game.

Although City had the better quality players across the pitch, the midfield quintet of Appleby were most definitely in control of the centre of the pitch and as such they were able to keep the ball away from City's midfield. Seeing the issues his midfield was having, Read used a break in play to pass instructions to his players to hit long balls and totally bypass both midfields and this new approach brought dividends very quickly with Kompany hitting a rakjng long pass which gave

Neilsson the opportunity to Turkiye in the air, allowing him to nod the ball onto strike partner Faure with the ball falling perfectly for him to smash past the Appleby keeper, putting City 1-0 up. With Appleby concentrating all their efforts to try to stop the home side playing, it meant that it was easy for the home side to contain them so they didn't cause any threat to their goal, but in turn, although Empire did rain down shots upon the Appleby goal, they were either partially blocked by the defence or saved by an inspired Belgique. There was only to be 1 other goal in the game and obviously it was the home side that scored it, as they forced 3 corners in a row, and from the third, they finally found the head of one of their own players, allowing Thai to power the ball into the net to give Empire City a 2-0 victory and put them just 3 points away from a well deserved title.

With both Lochend Thistle (2nd) & Juventus (3rd) picking up victories, it allowed them a little bit of a gap between them and Ratcliff Rovers in 4th, after they had scraped a 1-1 draw against would-be promotion rivals Harold Wood.

EDGING TOWARDS SAFETY

Ale Can City haven't exactly had the greatest of seasons and had been flirting with the bottom 3 all season long, coming into today's home game against fellow relegation rivals Jakku Rebellion in 9th place, but only 1 point above 10th placed Connaught FC, so 3 points were a must for their manager Allen to give them a slight buffer between them and the bottom 3.

Jakku Rebellion are a tricky team to judge, as Read had totally reshaped and rebuilt the squad but their rebirth was likely to start next season in division 4, and while they have some decent players, there's nobody in their team that was capable of grabbing the game by the scruff of the neck and that's one thing that may have to be rectified next season.

Ale Can set up in a balanced formation, giving them plenty of opportunity to support their forward line, while Jakku tried to flood the midfield to try to disrupt City's ability to start attacks and it could have succeeded if Read had tried to mark any of



City's dangermen but that didn't happen though what they do have are a team packed with ball winners so while they didn't utilise any marking, their quintet were still able to disrupt some of Ale Can's attacks with some fearsome tackling. Despite all of their efforts, Sheep managed to escape a couple of rash challenges on a mazy run into the area before driving the ball into the net, putting the home side into the lead but that was to be the only goal in the first half. Within 10 minutes of the second half starting, Ale Can had taken total control of the game, with their goals being scored by Bottas and Lewis giving them an unassailable 3-0 lead but that wasn't the end of the scoring, that came in the 88th minute with Edmonton heading home to make the final score 4-0 to Ale Can City, moving them up to 8th in the table and more importantly, allowing them to open a 3 point gap over the bottom 3.

TOP 2 UP BUT WHO WILL JOIN THEM

Wigan Warriors had the trickier game of the top 2 as they had to travel to 3rd placed GKA Flugels and though both sides had injury worries, the home side were missing 2 of their best players and to get past Wigan they could have done with them, but in the end the Flugels couldn't find any way past the experienced Bowen who has quickly become the best keeper in the league, and when Meatpacka scored just before half-time to give the Warriors the 3 points and with 2 games against leaders Confederates to come, they are still my favourites for the title.

As for Confederates, well they had to host a Haybrook side that in recent weeks had undergone a squad clearout leaving them with the bare bones of a squad, but a potload of cash in the bank ready for manager Hails's rebuilding job next season. Knowing that after recent weeks, they cannot afford to drop any more points, Confederates put out their full strength team and this meant that Corden wasn't required to work as hard as usual for the team, so he could have a nice rest and be

ready for the bigger tests to come. Even though Haybrook were a shadow of the side that Confederates played earlier in the season, they still had a couple of top class players in their squad so it did take the home side a little while before they finally managed to find a way to beat Ying Tong, and the goal came courtesy of the home side's creativity with Manfredi crossing it for Mozeltovs to volley the home side into the lead. It was Manfredi himself that made it 2-0 on 35 minutes, picking up the ball just outside the area and curling the ball beyond Ying Tong's reach and it didn't take long for Molotov to make it 3-0, heading home just before the break. With the game already won, the home side were able to relax a little in the second half but that still didn't stop Confederates from creating chance after chance and if it wasn't for Ying Tong the game could have gone into double figures although even he could do nothing to stop Mozeltovs free-kick on 56 minutes but fortunately for the away fans, there was only one more goal in the game, this time scored by Hulk 5 minutes before the end of the game, making the score 5-0 to Confederates, allowing them to keep that 4 point buffer to Wigan Warriors coming into the final 3 games of the season.

These are also the same levels which decide whether a player will go straight to N/L when out of contract rather than being put into the auction

AUCTION NOTES

From now onwards we would like you to always write, 'don't sell if he turns star in the messages to GM box EVEN IF HE IS A LEVEL TWELVE STAR, as well as ticking the relevant DON'T SELL box in teampick. NOTE THAT TICKING THE BOX IS THE MAIN DECISION-MAKER IN WHETHER A PLAYER IS SOLD OR NOT, the GM Message is just to help the GM as during the transfers we have no way of knowing whether a player has become level twelve in THAT SESSION.!

Also PLEASE DO NOT leave partially-completed transfers in your transfer section, i.e. leaving the team name or the player, etc., it is laziness on your part and might result in strange things happening to your team!!!

And you MUST spell the names of the players included in any deal correctly. If you don't then the program might refuse them and they don't go through, so be careful.

In future, you are allowed multiple conditional bids from which the program will attempt to purchase just one item. However, you are also allowed multiple Unconditional bids from which the program will attempt to purchase all. teampick users just have to use the relevant boxes in the program, those who don't use teampick must ensure they stick to these rules and make it clear on their turns just what they want to happen in their bidding process.

LSO, be careful when doing deals etc. The program works on team order, which can cause problems. Best idea is NOT to have 25 players in your squad at the start of a turn and do deals and sell to NL, cos if the manager you are doing a deal with has a lower team number than yours, the program will say you have no space in your squad, even though you are trying to sell players to the non-league. His orders will be processed before yours!!

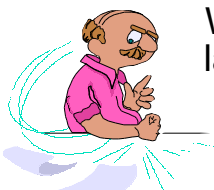

MARKING UPDATE



We have worked out a system to check on anybody who is using last season's marking numbers for the current season. 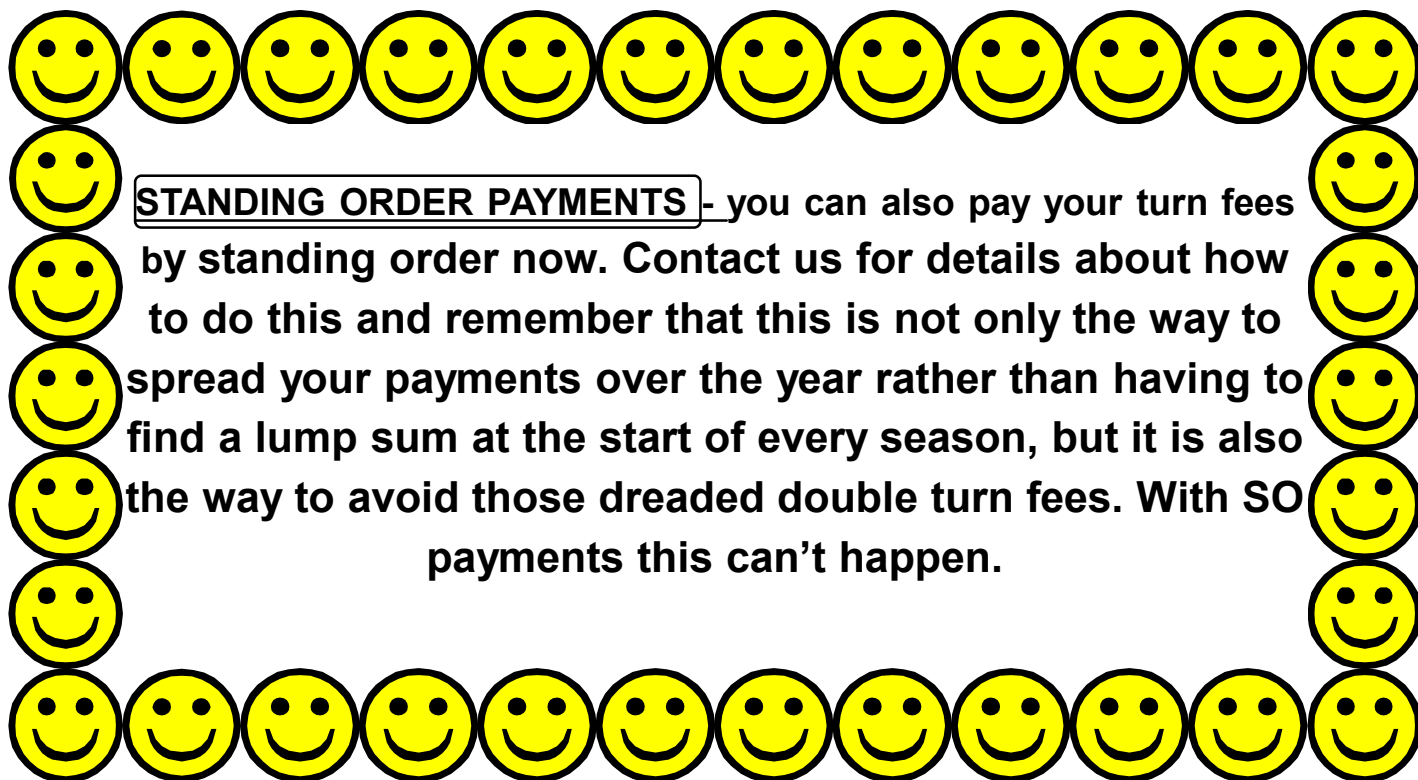

Contact us for details about how to do this and remember that this is not only the way to spread your payments over the year rather than having to find a lump sum at the start of every season, but it is also the way to avoid those dreaded double turn fees. With SO payments this can't happen.

PLEASE NOTE

You will all notice a new stat on your turnsheets. In the space where BW/CR stats are listed there will be a X% number against all goalkeepers. This will rate your GK on his shot-saving ability and will be cumulative.

Two points to note. It does not include penalties and own goals, but does include friendlies. And before shouting that it is wrong, remember that all shots against you are tested against the sweeper for blocking them before the GK.

I have some ideas about how to use this stat in the future so watch this space

KA MUSINGS & MEANDERINGS

As there are a number of leagues that will be starting a new season in the next three or four months perhaps it is time to point out the cardinal sin that often happens with a new season. That is discovering an app in your first game of the season AS A SUB and then trying to play him in the subsequent matches (this refers to teampick teams by the way). In effect if you discover somebody as a sub he doesn't actually exist and you HAVE to discover him in the normal fashion the first time you play him. If you don't get this right you incur wrong formations and NL fees, which will NOT be refunded so get it right

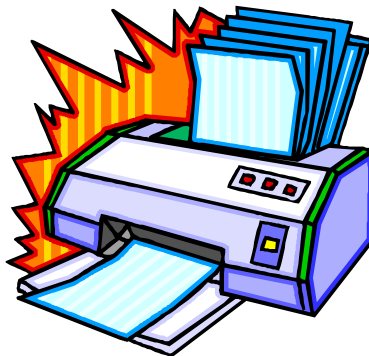
