



## TOP OF THE TABLE, BUT FOR HOW LONG

Rosinborg FC and Wexford Wraiths came into their matches battling for the title at the top of the table, as they had done the previous season and neither were up against easy opponents with Rosinborg hosting Metropole IF (the 3<sup>rd</sup> team promoted last season), while Wexford Wraiths hosted last season's champions, Incipient Utd, who were starting to show shoots of recovery after a terrible start to the season.

While 2<sup>nd</sup> placed Rosinborg were able to field a full strength side, their opponents 5<sup>th</sup> placed Metropole IF were missing the influential Cosa Nostra who foolishly managed to get himself suspended last week meaning the home side had one less person to worry about, especially as they needed to replace him with a youngster that's going to be decent but not in Nostra's league. Both managers marked opposing players successfully, but for Metropole it left them lacking in midfield against Rosinborg's quintet, definitely not ideal when they happen to be your derby opponents. As with many of Metropole's opponents this season, Rosinborg found their tough tackling and close marking hard to deal with but the only marks Metropole made were in the ref's notebook with both Timisoara and Addia Abbeba having their names taken for niggly tackles but at least the kept it 0-0 at the break. It was a different story in the second half as within 2 minutes Rosinborg managed to break their opponent's resistance when Bill crossed the ball over for his midfield partner Dyfed to volley home the opening goal and they hit them again before they could get organised but this time it was captain Laffiate that hammered home a shot from the edge of the area to make the score 2-0. That goal did kill off the game with Rosinborg easily able to close the game out but towards the end of the game, Baddaddio, in his enthusiasm to get to the player he was marking, tore his hamstring and will be missing the rest of the season which isn't ideal for his manager. This victory moved Rosinborg to the top of the table after former leaders Wexford Wraiths somehow managed to lose at home to Incipient Utd but this was due to their keeper picking today to have an absolute mare, as it was his mistakes that led to both of United's goals in a game the Wraiths had dominated.

## NOW WE HAVE A PROPER BATTLE FOR PROMOTION

FC Garvock have managed to stay safely in the top 3 but lately Royal Aston have really been on a charge and before this week's set of games were only a point behind Garvock and both teams had to go on potentially tricky visits with Garvock travelling to Essex to play AS Worg (hope they took their shots first) and Royal Aston travelling to play a possible promotion rival in Gondor City, but I'll be concentrating on Garvock this week.

Garvock's opponents are a strange team that's for sure, their manager has a mixture potential stars as well as a few journeymen so they are capable of excellent results as well as pure dross so their fans never know which team is going to turn up week to week (bit like being a Spurs fan.) Although Worg were missing their captain for the game, their squad was big enough to cope with it so it was a surprise when Stevens opted to play his new schoolboy in his place, ensuring Garvock's midfield would have full control over it and with Oyston also

marking Mikado out of the game, it left the home side severely lacking in that area. The game started off in explosive fashion with Hogan heading home a Boyd cross after only 5 minutes although it didn't take Garvock very long to recover from that early setback as in the 13<sup>th</sup> minute, De Lesseps was in the perfect position to stroke the ball into the corner and just 4 minutes later Garvock took the lead with Allahor poking the ball home after Daffyd had pushed the ball onto the post. Garvock now had the scent of blood in their nostrils as those 2 quick goals put their opponents on the ropes. Now in the ascendancy, Garvock decided to put their foot firmly on their opponent's throat, Bertolini taking advantage of a misplaced Vicente pass and before Daffyd could close him down, he fired the ball high into the net, making it 3-1 and they continued to increase the home fan's pain in the 34<sup>th</sup> minute as Allahor scored his second goal of the game as he rose highest in the area to head the ball into the corner to make it 4-1 to Garvock at half time. With the game looking as if it was won, Garvock's intensity dropped just a bit which gave Worg that little bit of breathing

space to try to get their passing game going again but even utilising that space, the home side still found it hard to find chinks in the Garvock defence and it took a moment of brilliance by Hogan for Worg to score what was to be a consolation goal as he easily turned the defender and fire home at the near post but once they had conceded this goal, Garvock woke up and snapped into tackles once again, denying Worg any space to work their keeper allowing them to ease to a 4-2 victory although with Royal Aston pulling off an excellent 2-0 victory against Gondor City, it means the gap between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> places stays at a slender 1 point.

Ignoring Westhill FC at the top of the table as they are 12 points ahead of Peters Utd in 2<sup>nd</sup> place, there were no fewer than 6 teams in contention for the final 2 promotion so this week's games could help separate the men from the boys, but this week I think I'll concentrate of the fortunes of 5<sup>th</sup> placed Osasuna Orlata who were only 2 points behind Liverpool Stars in 3<sup>rd</sup> place and Orlata's game was away against the injury hit Admiral City, who haven't had the best of times since their promotion.

Admiral City's management opted to use the unorthodox 2-4-4, while Osasuna went for their customary 3-3-3 with captain Keown patrolling behind them in what might be his swansong as he's getting no younger. The pattern of the game was set from the first whistle as Osasuna played the ball back to their defence and they proceeded to take out city's midfield with a raking long ball, this was nodded down by Iain straight into the path of Alitalia and without thinking, he flicked the ball over the home keeper before he had even gotten settled and he was in the right spot again to sweep home a cross in the 5<sup>th</sup> minute putting Osasuna into a very early 2-0 and even though there was still 85 minutes left to play the home fans already saw that the writing was on the wall for their side with their relegation struggle continuing at pace added to the fact their goal difference was deteriorating by the minute. By now the game was dead as a contest, and though City did manage a couple of shots, they were both easily fielded by the away keeper, whereas every time Osasuna came forward, it looked as if they were going to score.

Despite their dominance, Osasuna only scored 2 more goals, both around the hour mark with Gurley poking the ball home in the 59<sup>th</sup> minute before Alitalia completed his hat-trick in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute to make the final score 5-0 to Osasuna Orlata, a result that moved them to 4<sup>th</sup> in the table above Solaris Saints after they were held to a goalless draw by Tolpudde,

Elsewhere Liverpool Stars consolidated 3<sup>rd</sup> place with a 2-0 away win against bottom of the table Buckkeep, 2<sup>nd</sup> placed Peters Utd were held to a 2-2 draw by 7<sup>th</sup> placed Steel City, while 6<sup>th</sup> placed Galway Loftus were held 0-0 by a stubborn Southpark Jnrs. Both sides opted to play balanced formations, almost cancelling each other out but with the players Breznitz has at his disposal, he was hoping his side would make short work of his opponents. ## AUCTION NOTES

From now onwards we would like you to always write, 'don't sell if he turns star in the messages to GM box EVEN IF HE IS A LEVEL TWELVE STAR, as well as ticking the relevant DON'T SELL box in teampick. NOTE THAT TICKING THE BOX IS THE MAIN DECISION-MAKER IN WHETHER A PLAYER IS SOLD OR NOT, the GM Message is just to help the GM as during the transfers we have no way of knowing whether a player has become level twelev in THAT SESSION.!

Also PLEASE DO NOT leave partially-completed transfers in your transfer section, i.e. leaving the team name or the player, etc., it is laziness on your part and might result in strange things happening to your team!!!

And you MUST spell the names of the players included in any deal correctly. If you don't then the program might refuse them and they don't go through, so be careful.

**In future, you are allowed multiple conditional bids from which the program will attempt to purchase just one item.** However, you are also allowed multiple Unconditional bids from which the program will attempt to purchase all. teampick users just have to use the relevant boxes in the program, those who don't use teampick must ensure they stick to these rules and make it clear on their turns just what they want to happen in their bidding process.

**LSO, be careful when doing deals etc. The program works on team order, which can cause problems. Best idea is NOT to have 25 players in your squad at the start of a turn and do deals and sell to NL, cos if the manager you are doing a deal with has a lower team number than yours, the program will say you have no space in your squad, even though you are trying to sell players to the non-league. His orders will be processed before yours!!**



**Two points to note. It does not include penalties and own goals, but does include friendlies. And before shouting that it is wrong, remember that all shots against you are tested against the sweeper for blocking them before the GK.**

## KA MUSINGS & MEANDERINGS
